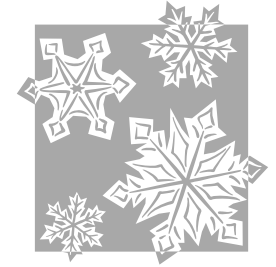


AMICALOLA FALLS STATE PARK & LODGE
